A technical report digitization project and repository, TRAIL began in 2006 under the auspices of the Greater Western Library Alliance, in association with the Center for Research Libraries. Led by Maliaca Oxnam at the University of Arizona, and supported by a small cadre of engineering and government documents librarians from around the country, TRAIL's mission is to catalog and digitize older, at risk, and otherwise largely undiscoverable U.S. government agency technical reports.

Now a Global Resource Network at CRL, TRAIL deploys a user interface at [www.technicalreports.org](http://www.technicalreports.org) which allows access to its available content.

To date TRAIL has cataloged, digitized and made openly available over 28,000 reports. Reports from dozens of series are included in the repository, with the largest numbers coming from the agencies listed here.

TRAIL is a member organization, and is reliant upon those members for the funding it needs to do its work. To date, 34 organizations claim membership within TRAIL, but more are needed in order for TRAIL to continue its good work.
