COLLABORATIVE FEDERAL DEPOSITORY LIBRARY PROGRAM [CFDP]

UPDATE – February 2018

Highlights –

- 37 of ASERL's 38 members are FDLP libraries; 12 Regional Depositories in 10 states.
- Old Dominion University is the newest Center of Excellence for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA, C55.1-99) and the Navy Department (D201-D219). There are now 41 libraries serving as Centers of Excellence (COE) as part of this program; 30 are Selective Depositories, and 9 COE libraries (22%) are located in the Southeast but are not members of ASERL.
- COE libraries have adopted six Cabinet-level agencies, 1 format collection (maps), 3 subject collections (Panama Canal, Cuba and the City of Atlanta) and 230 SuDoc classifications. 15 agencies have been adopted by a second COE. - The Collaborative Federal Depository Program (CFDP) is included in an upcoming special edition of the *Against the Grain* which focuses on national and potentially international efforts to collect and preserve digital government information and data.

ASERL Disposition Database:

The University of Florida developed and hosts the ASERL Disposition Database to facilitate the disposition of federal documents within the Southeast as a means of supporting the Guidelines for Managing FDLP Collections in the Southeast Region.

There are 11 service areas represented 308 depository libraries in the Disposition Database: Alabama, Florida (← includes Puerto Rico and Virgin Islands), Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and Maryland (← includes District of Columbia and Delaware).

From July-June of FY2017 – 254,350 documents have been posted to the ASERL Disposition Database for “adoption” by other FDLP libraries, of which 12,528 documents were claimed. Of those claimed, 3099 documents were claimed for use in Center of Excellence collections; the others were claimed for non-COE parts of local FDLP collections. Since the database was launched in 2012, more than 67,890 documents posted for disposal have been claimed by another library and added to their collections.

Database enhancements: Recent enhancements allow libraries to export both their needs lists, and their list of Expired Offers for uploading to the FDLP eXchange, GPO’s new national Needs/Offer database. This enhancement eliminates duplication of effort and promotes the use of the FDLP eXchange database, improving gap-filling at the national level.
